
Rescue African Children

Kamuli District, I was born in a family of four children, two boys and two girls and I am the first born. I am pursuing a certificate in Medical records Management and Informatics at St. Francis School of Health Sciences. Mukono. In November. 2018 I finished my first semester. I am now in my second semester. In first semester we had course units like; how to give first aid, Anatomy, Primary Health Care (PHC), Medical Record Management and Customer care. Since we are to work in medical records, we are given all the necessary medical basics. I am indeed very happy at school and working hard.

I wish to thank my sponsors through our Director Fred Tumwebaze for being kind

to our vulnerable family. Our mother and father died in the same year 2009, when I was in Senior two and they left us in the state of wondering what to do next. It was our mother who died first after giving birth to twins, one boy and one girl, she died of over bleeding in the month of January, 2009 and shortly after one month, our father also died in March 2009 of an unknown death. Death darkened our future. After the burial of our parents, we were left in a lonely home and I accepted to be the

father and mother in all ways. I kept on moving from place to place looking for a job, where I could be able to earn some small money for a living and I could work with the desire to help my siblings.

Then God blessed me with the coming of the Director of Rescue African Children, Rev. Fred Tumwebaze and he was so sympathetic for our family and he voluntarily promised to seek support for our family. It was not so long he sent

news that, "my prayers had been answered." My heart rejoiced and from that particular day, I believed the God we serve, is the God of amazements. At St. Francis School of Medical & Health Sciences, all people are so good to me and I now have friends who comfort me. My prayer request is: "May the Almighty God help me finish my certificate in Medical records Management successfully. And also take good care of my sponsors". My future goal is to upgrade to a

diploma level, since the level of education in Uganda determines the wage.

The twins are now in boarding at Omega School and Fred is in primary seven this year in a near by school to home. We are so thankful that our house will soon be better to live in after all the changes that are

to be done to completion.

Questions have been asked about Rebecca recently. Here are some answers: Fred is currently boarding at the school while nearby family are keeping up the property. The family home will require close to \$3000 more since "the roof must go off and we put a ring beam then put a new roof. Plaster inside and out, concrete then cemented floor, the latrine and place to cook" all are requiring attention. Pictured to your right are the Tumwebaze kids. Fred's daughter Nissi sits in between her brothers. When her Father was asked if she feels as good as she looks, his answer was a happy, "Yes".
