Omega school children are still on a 4-week holiday ending on September 4th. We are looking forward to their return to school. However, for the candidate class, it is a different story. We only released them last Friday on August 26th. They have only a one week break since more work is required from them. Please continue to pray for us and the candidate class as they are going to do their finals in early November. It is amazing that my oldest son, Jeremiah is also among the candidates this year, 2022.

I would like to offer thanks for all the help given for the purchase of food to families that are struggling. We were able to give them some 10kg each and about 200 families have been able to benefit so far. However, this is like a drop in the ocean. The harvest was so bad so the food supply is very low. The rains came late and most crops didn't make it. We are now beginning to plant again but still rain is not coming on time. We will continue to try to provide food. You see a lot of joy when people receive this small help. They keep saying, "God bless you. God bless you".

As an announcement, Pastor Wambulira, Moses wedded this month on August 6th, 2022 and it was a great celebration.
