We have been making our own bricks and they are at the stage where we burn them before we are able to use them for the walls. So far, we've casted all pillars, and are getting set to cast the slab. We placed all rebar and other needed materials, but are running short of \$8000 to cater for labor and cement, lumber, etc. Our aim is to cast the slab early November 2024 depending on how funds will come in. My name is Kisakye Keziah Priscilla, an old student of Omega Modern Primary School and this is my story..In December 2007, my parents got into an accident that took my mother to coma and claimed my Father due to internal bleeding. I was left helpless. Paying school dues became hard as my mother was in coma for over 8 months with very little hope of making it. In 2009, I was taken up by REACH, an organization that helps the disadvantaged children to acquire quality education through Reverend Fred Tumwebaze. I studied free of charge in the boarding section from primary 4 to primary 7 and got 8 aggregate, not forgetting the gifts we used to receive for Christmas every year, up to secondary school. I am forever indebted to the Director for believing in me. In 2013, I

joined secondary school, I had my ordinary level in Mpoma School and advanced level in Budini School. After high school, I joined Busitema University and pursued a Bachelor's in Science Education (chemistry and mathematics). I graduated last year and I am now a teacher of Chemistry and Mathematics. I am currently stationed at Comprehensive College Kitettika. Words cannot explain how grateful I am. I do not know how my education would be without Omega. Omega School has changed many lives, and that cannot stop. Gratitude goes to our sponsors and our Director. If he had not listened to God's call to help us, personally I do not know where I would get a foundation as good as the one Omega gave me.
