Greetings to you all the family of REACH. I am so glad for this privilege of sharing with you, my life story. I am called Faith Nakabenjja, born on the 23rd of December, 2006. I am from a family of six children, 4 girls and 2 boys. I am the 4th born. Our parents are still alive but were very poor and could not take care of us all. So, they sent me to stay with my sister in Buwenge. She took me to Omega School and registered me for sponsorship with REACH. I then started writing letters to my sponsors and I was so happy to hear that I had a sponsor. I was also happy for the gifts we received each year from sponsors at Christmas. My educational journey at Omega School began in Primary one in 2011 and I completed Primary seven in 2017. REACH provided us with essential learning materials, Uniforms etc.

Upon completing my primary education, I joined secondary school from 2018 up to 2022 and later pursued a certificate course in Medical Laboratory Assistant at a reputable Medical Laboratory Institute from 2023 to 2024. There I gained practical skills and knowledge. I am currently working as a Medical Laboratory Assistant, contributing to the wellbeing of the community. I am grateful for the support from REACH and for sure, it was life changing and it gave me hope and a chance to pursue my dreams. I am proud to be working in a clinic, helping patients and making a difference. Thank you...Faith Nakabejja

Administration Note: We want to continue to be transparent about how funds are mobilized once they reach Uganda. Our 501(C)3 says they must be pooled to support all the children at the school once they arrive at Omega. (*This doesn't apply for Pastors.*) All Omega kids eat a meal everyday and have their needs met (like medical), whether they are sponsored or not, as it should be! If at anytime a child leaves the school or area, the funds designated for that child remain at Omega. REACH USA is in communication with the school on larger issues, and sometimes the transitions of kids are not communicated in the timely manner that they should be. We do apologize and ask for multitudes of grace for this. Please be assured that the funds remain at the school and that this ministry is accountable to God, both here and in Uganda. Omega School continues to thrive and achieve accolades for its achievements. Pastor Fred gives all glory to God. The fruits are good! Also please know, like Faith, they love that they are sponsored, prayed for, and loved by you.
