JOAN NANGOMA'S STORY

My name is Joan Nangoma , I was born on April 19,1995. In 2005, when at 10 years old, I found hope through Rescue African Children when their social workers visited my village and registered me for sponsorship. I was taken to Omega School while in primary two so that I could continue with my schooling. Later I was so glad to learn that I had gotten a sponsor. I studied at Omega



School up to Primary Seven, having all my school needs taken care of by REACH. In 2011, I sat for my Primary Leaving Exams (PLE) and scored a high grade. I became so happy that I did not waste my sponsorship. I then pushed ahead and joined Secondary School from 2012 to 2015 and I passed well.



During my vacation I got a teaching temporary job since I was looking to find my calling. I chose to follow my heart because of the love I had for the children. After seeing how they asked questions and witnessing how their faces lit up when they understood, I chose to join the Teacher's Training College. It was a two years course from 2016 to 2018 and I graduated in 2018. I am proud to say that I am now a qualified Primary School Teacher, handling lower primary (P.2 and P.3). Today, am aged 31 years and married with one child. Working with a private

Primary School, I am teaching Mathematics. At home, I use my salary to help take care of my child, and my young siblings. I am where I am because sponsors chose to support REACH, "My job now is to rescue others with the knowledge I have. Thanks to my sponsors for giving me a chance to become someone who adds value to others."
